LIFELINES: British Member of Parliament William Wilberforce toiled for many decades to end the scourge of slavery in Britain in the 18th & 19th centuries. He was one of just a few voices to speak out. But after years of dedication, he helped pass a ban on the slave trade. We can take a lesson from Wilberforce. He knew the institutions that supported slavery were strong -Parliament, the commercial sectors. He knew that many people made huge profits from slavery, just as many do today with abortion. He also knew that determination and hard work would educate ordinary people and this movement would grow as a voice for the voiceless...and eventually win. Our struggle in the U.S. to end another injustice has gone on for more than four decades. Polls show many more Americans consider themselves pro-life, especially strong among the young. Just as Wilberforce could not give up after his first major victories, we cannot possibly give up now. As Wilberforce showed, one person can make an enormous difference! We can also do the same.
